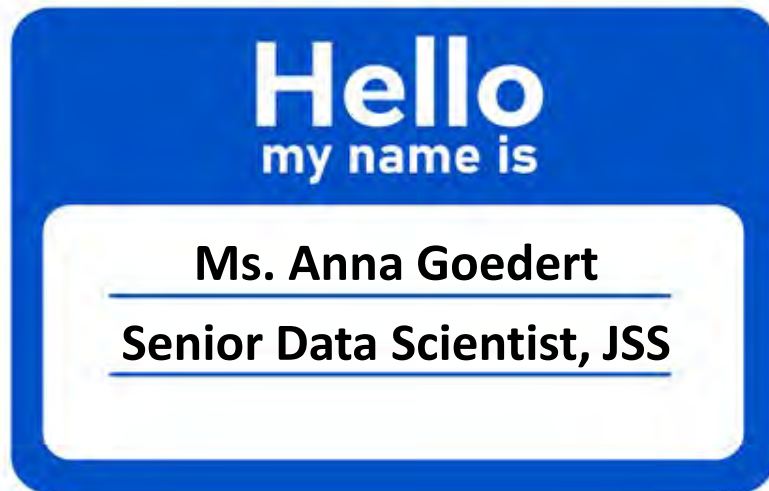

What is Training & Technical Assistance (TTA)?

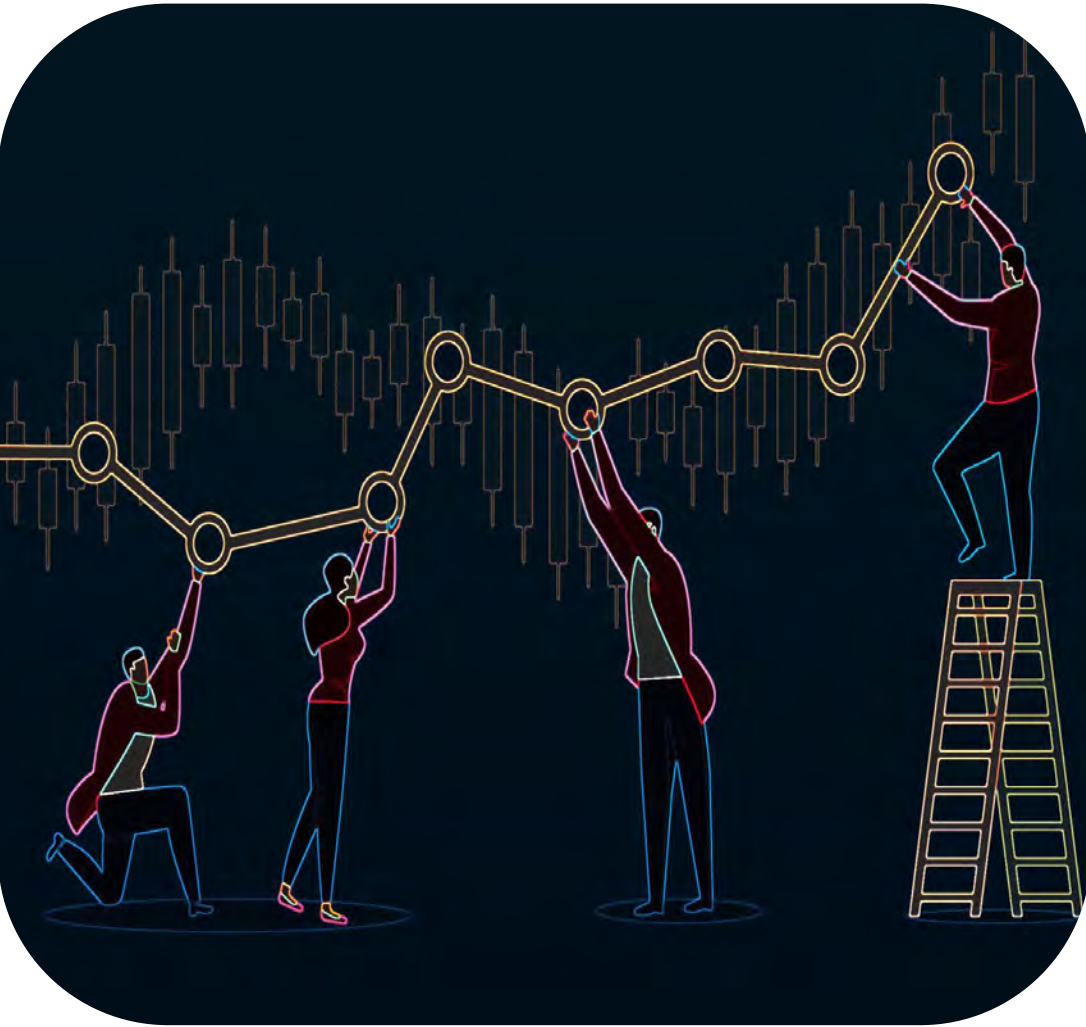
Ensure success in reducing violence

- Listen and assist you with overcoming challenges and issues.



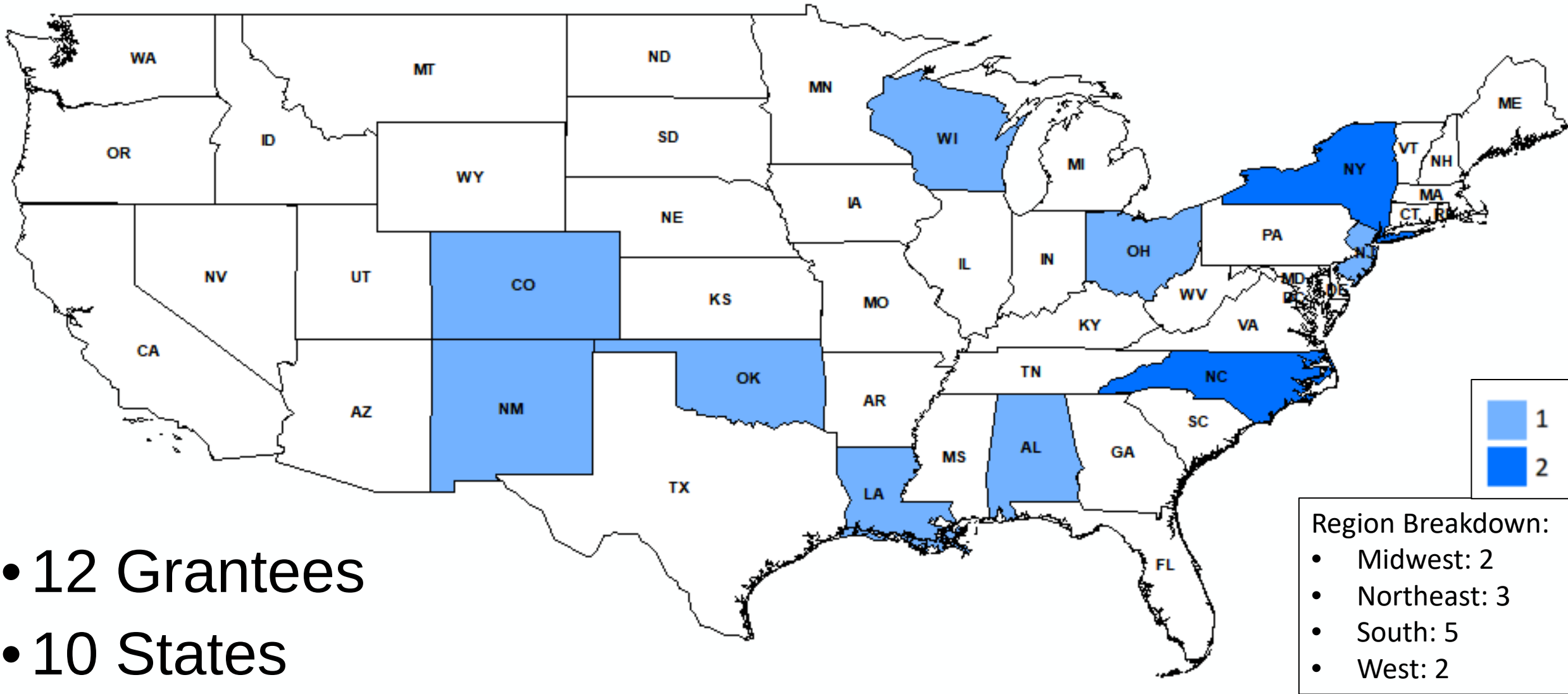

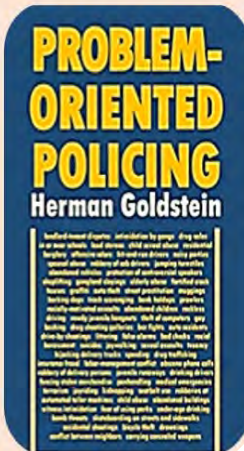
